# US to sanction Belarus state firms

There has been an attempt to stir up the situation so it would end up being similar to that of August last year. It is simply clear what these Western friends want from us: Lukashenko, on the 2020 mass election protests in Belarus.

Washington

After the forced landing of a passenger plane in the Belarusian capital Minsk with a dissident journalist on board, the US government has said it will reinstate sanctions against nine Belarusian state-owned companies next week.

The White House did not name the nine state-owned companies targeted by the sanctions, which are to be reinstated as of June 2, reports dpa. In addition, the US "is developing a list of targeted sanctions against key members of the (President Alexander) Lukashenko regime associated with ongoing abuses of human rights and corruption, the falsification of the 2020 election, and the events of May 23", Press Secretary Jen Psaki said.

The US measures come on top of EU sanctions against the authorities in Belarus.

Sanctions against Lukashenko's government were tightened after a Ryanair flight from Athens to Vilnius was diverted to Minsk on May 23.

A new legal instrument is being prepared to give US President Joe Biden more leeway to impose further punitive measures. The State Department had issued a travel warning for Belarus, and the Feder-

al Aviation Authorities warned passenger airlines to "exercise extreme caution when considering flying in Belarusian airspace".

Russian President Vladimir Putin and his visiting Belarusian counterpart Lukashenko met Friday in Sochi where the leaders discussed the aftermath of the incident.

During the meeting, Putin agreed with Lukashenko's opinion that the reaction to the Ryanair landing demonstrated an "emotional outburst", and added there were many other common fields of interest

both leaders could discuss, Xinhua quoted the statement as saying.

Putin recalled an incident that took place in 2013, when the airplane of the Bolivian President was forced to land at a different location, pointing out the reaction back then was rather quiet.

Lukashenko in turn told Putin he would show him documents related to the recent emergency landing of the Ryanair flight.

"There has been an attempt to stir up the situation so it would end up being similar to that of August last year..It is simply clear what these Western friends want from us," he said, speaking of mass election protests in Belarus in 2020.

### Belarusians increasingly cornered after EU cuts air links

As fear of repression rises among Belarusians following the arrest of the dissident journalist, those who want to leave the country are feeling increasingly cornered. Its land borders already were under

tight restrictions, and now the European Union has banned flights from Belarus. That leaves opposition-minded Belarusians with few options to get out from under the authoritarian rule of Lukashenko.

"Shutting the borders turns Belarus into a can of rotting preserves. We are being turned into hostages," said Tatsiana Hatura-Yavorska, who leads a rights group that helps those released from prison adapt to life and also organises documentary film festivals.

"The authorities have scaled up repressions in recent months to incite the atmosphere of fear," she told The Associated Press. Hatura-Yavorska said most of her friends and associates have faced detention, searches and brutal beatings, and many have fled Belarus.

She served 10 days in jail after organising a photo exhibition about medical workers in the coronavirus pandemic that authorities decided leaned toward the opposition. She faces charges that could land her in prison for three years.

Lukashenko, who has led the former Soviet nation of 9.3 million for more than a quarter century, has faced unprecedented protests after his reelection to a 6th term in an August 2020 vote that the opposition rejects as rigged.

# Winning prez polls slap in faces of enemies: Assad

Damascus

After scoring a sweeping victory in this weeks presidential election, incumbent Syrian President Bashar al-Assad said that the vote was "a slap in the faces of enemies".

Assad made the remarks in a televised address Friday after his election victory, where he said the vote constituted an "unprecedented challenge to enemies of the homeland", apparently referring to the Western-backed exiled opposition, the armed rebels, and the US and its allies which have de-



nounced the election as "illegitimate", reports Xinhua.

Hailing the Syrian people who voted in the election, Assad said they have re-defined the meaning of revolution, adding his re-election is "a great honour" to him.

A day earlier, Assad won his fourth seven-year term in the 2021 presidential race with 95.1 per cent of the vote as opposed to 88.7 per cent in the 2014 election.

The number of eligible voters inside and outside Syria was estimated at more than 18 million, 14 million of whom cast their votes in the election with a turnout rate of 78.64 per cent.

A joint statement issued on Tuesday by the US, the UK, France, Germany and Italy slammed the election as "illegitimate".

"Syria's presidential election will be neither free nor fair," the statement said.

On July 17, 2000, Assad succeeded his father Hafez al-Assad as the Syrian President. Assad's win in this year's elections was largely anticipated as his competitors in the race were a low-profile opposition figure and a former cabinet minister.

At least two people were killed and 317 others injured during celebratory gunfire in Syria marking President Bashar al-Assad's re-election to a fourth term, a war monitor reported on Saturday.

The casualties resulted from celebratory shots fired randomly by Assad's supporters in several areas including the capital Damascus and the northern city of Aleppo, dpa news agency quoted the UK-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights as saying.

The two who died were a young man and a child in Aleppo, the observatory said.

Assad was re-elected for a fourth seven-year term with 95.1 per cent of the ballots in the election in government-held areas and dismissed by the opposition as a sham.

Three contenders, including Assad, ran in Wednesday's polls, Syria's second presidential election since the country's civil war started in 2011.

The election was condemned as fraudulent by Syria's opposition as well as countries such as the



# Mali coup leader named interim Prez

Bamako: Colonel Assimi Goita, who led a military coup in the West African nation of Mali this week, has been named the interim President.

Mali's Constitutional Court published a judgement late Friday declaring that Goita would assume the presidency, reports dpa.

The judgement gives Goita, who is also the Vice President, the power to lead the interim government and "lead the transition process to its conclusion".

Goita also asked the opposition coalition movement M5-RFP to name a candidate for Prime Minister.

The coalition was key in mobilising demonstrations that led to a coup last year.

The group announced politician Choguel Kokalla Maiga as their candidate in a Friday evening press briefing.

The court judgement noted "the vacancy of the presidency of the transition following the resignation of Bah N'Daw, prez of the transition, head of state". N'Daw and PM Moctar Ouane were forced to resign after being detained for several days in a coup staged by Goita.

On Tuesday, Goita announced that they had been deposed and promised new elections in 2022.

The trigger was the military's anger over a cabinet reshuffle that saw two senior military officers stripped of their positions.

# Palestine condemns Israel's settlement expansion plan

Ramallah: The Palestinian Ministry of Foreign Affairs has condemned Israel's settlement expansion, saying that authorities in the Jewish state recently approved the construction of 560 new settlement units south of the West Bank city of Bethlehem.

"Construction of new units aims at expanding the settlements that were built on Palestinian citizens' lands in the area," the Ministry said in a statement sent to Xinhua news agency on Friday.

The statement warned that the expansion of settlements in the area of Bethlehem in the West Bank "will isolate Palestinian towns and villages from each other and turn them



into isolated islands in an ocean of settlements".

The Foreign Ministry held the Israeli government responsible for the settlement expansion and the seizing of Palestinian lands, and warned of its disastrous consequences for the chances of making peace.

The Palestinians, who claim all of the West Bank, Gaza and East Jerusalem, and a majority of the international community consider the settlements a violation of international law and a hurdle to peace.

More than 600,000 Jews live in about 140 settlements in the West Bank and East Jerusalem..

# \$6 trillion budget to help US compete better against China

Washington

America has proposed a \$6 trillion budget for the coming fiscal year, which pitches massive investment plans to rebuild infrastructure and position the country to better compete with China. US's budget for the year starting October 1 earmarked \$715 billion for the Defence Dept, including \$5.09 billion to erect an initiative to bolster deterrence in the Indo-Pacific region facing China's assertiveness, and plans to procure 85 F-35 fighter jets.

"China poses the greatest long-term challenge to the US," the Pentagon said in its budget overview, adding that Beijing's military modernisation activities in recent decades have "sought to erode the ability of US forces to project power in the region."

"If left unimpeded, the continued erosion could fundamentally challenge our ability to achieve US defence objectives and to defend the sovereignty of our allies," Kyodo News quoted the Pentagon.

According to the news agency, the budget request for the Defence Dept represented a 1.6 per cent rise over the fiscal 2021 enacted level.

The president's budget request, which seeks \$6.01 trillion in total outlays, reflected his \$2.3 trillion infrastructure investment proposal and \$1.8 trillion education and child care investment plan - the former spanning 8 years and the latter 10 years.

"Together, these plans reinvest in the future of the US economy and workers and would help the nation out-compete China and other countries around the world."

# Germany offers \$1.3 billion aid to massacres in Namibia

Berlin: Germany has officially recognised its killing of tens of thousands of people in colonial Namibia as a genocide.

The victims belonged to the Herero and Nama peoples. German soldiers carried out the massacres between 1904 and 1908 in reprisal for an uprising against colonial rule.

"In the light of Germany's historical and moral responsibility, we will ask Namibia and the descendants of the victims for forgiveness," NHK World said quoting German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas.

Welcoming the conclusion of the talks with Namibia on recognising the killings committed by German troops in the country in the

early 20th century as genocide, Maas said that Berlin will pay 1.1 billion euros (\$1.3 bn) as compensation.

"I am happy and grateful that we were able to reach an agreement with Namibia on the common approach to the darkest chapter in our shared history. Five years later, [Special Envoy] Ruprecht Polenz and his Namibian counterpart Zed Ngavirue were able to conclude the negotiations, which they conducted on behalf of our two governments and the request of our two parliaments," Maas said, adding that the German government will offer the African country "a special program for reconstruction in development of 1.1 billion euros."

# Indonesia ferry catches fire at sea

JAKARTA: A ferry in eastern Indonesia caught fire early Saturday with nearly 200 people on board, forcing passengers and crew to jump into the sea but causing no casualties, officials said.

The ferry KM Karya Indah was headed for Sanana, a port on the remote island of Limalatola, said Wisnu Wardana, a spokesperson for the sea transportation directorate general. The fire broke out 15 minutes after the vessel departed Ternate, the provincial capital of North Maluku province, at around 7 am. A National Search and Rescue Agency video showed passen-



gers and crew clinging to floating objects as they struggled in the choppy water, while the raging fire on the sent up clouds of black smoke.

Wardana said all 181 passengers, including 22 children, and 14 crew members were rescued and safely evacuated

to a nearby island. He said the agency's rescue operation also involved local fishing boats that happened to be in the vicinity.

He said authorities were still investigating the cause, as survivors said that the fire originated in the engine room. Ferry accidents are common in Indonesia, the world's largest archipelago nation with more than 17,000 islands. Many accidents are blamed on the lax regulation of boat services.

# Six nabbed in B'desh for gangraping girl in minibus

DHAKA: Bangladesh police have arrested six people for allegedly gangraping a 22-year old woman on a moving bus in Savar area.

The crime occurred in the Ashulia cattle market area. The victim filed a case with the Ashulia police station soon afterwards, the BD News reported.

The 6 accused, who drive passenger buses, have been identified as Aryan, 18, Shaju, 20, Sumon Miah, 24, Monowar, 24, Shohag, 25, and Saiful Islam, 40. All of

them are residents of the Kamarpara area in Turag.

The victim was heading home to Narayanganj from her sister's house in Manikganj and arrived at the Nabinagar bus stand Friday 8pm to catch another bus. The woman met an acquaintance named Nazmul there, Ashulia Police Inspector Ziaul Islam said.

As they were waiting for another public transport, a bus driven by Sumon, who was aided by Monowar and Saiful, arrived. They said

they would charge Tk 35 for a trip to Tongi Station Road. Once they were on the bus, the perpetrators dropped off the other passengers and then restrained Nazmul and the victim, and took them back to Nabinagar where she was raped by six assailants inside the bus, police said.

A police patrol heard Nazmul's screams for help, stopped the vehicle and rescued them. The accused have been sent on a 4-day remand for questioning.
